

# Field Trips to The National Building Museum

The National Building Museum is happy to announce a new lineup of field trips for the 2025-2026 school year, featuring nine curated themes with at least three student workshop options for each grade level, all tied to regional content standards.

## Student Workshops

Each field trip will feature three 45-minute rotations between our exhibitions and classrooms. For our early learners in PreK3-1st grade, these rotations are reduced to 20-25 minutes each. If your field trip is a self-guided visit (not part of a facilitated program), group rates are available. This includes independent access to all exhibits.

These programs are closely tied to content and curriculum standards in DC, MD, and VA.

### Three Little Pigs (for PreK & K classes) 🏠🐷🔪

In this program, students will explore different building materials and test their strengths and weaknesses through the classic story of the Three Little Pigs.

### Meet the Museum (PreK-K grades) 🏠🗺️👤

Through this program we will introduce our youngest visitors to the fun we can have in a museum. Learners will explore how to move through a museum while taking in all the wonders of our galleries and artifacts. *Meet the Museum* is a chance to lay the foundation for our youngest visitors to be lifelong learners and museum-enthusiasts.

### Career Exploration (PreK-12th grade) 🏠👤🔧

This program explores careers at the heart of the National Building Museum. During this hands-on experience, learners will explore both construction-based careers and arts and culture careers like curators, preservationists and exhibition designers, opening students to a world of possibilities.

### Build Your Story (Pre-K-3rd grade) 🏠📖

Based on our newest long-term exhibition, *Building Stories*, this program delves into the world of children's storybooks. By comparing the author/illustrator of the storybook to the architect of a structure, we can talk about similarities in the design process and ways that structures and construction cross over into literature.

### Foundations of Building (K-12th grade) 🏠🔧📐

In this program we will delve into the basics of building. This program will incorporate elements of geometry, art and design into learning all about the process of building and the tools and materials used.

### City By Design (2nd-6th grade) 🏠🗺️👤

In this updated version of our 20 year+ mainstay program, students will become city planners to look at the development of Washington DC and its neighborhoods before planning and building their own model city.



### Designing for Disaster (3rd-12th grade) 🏠🔧🌪️

This program dives into how engineers solve architectural and design problems using the context of building earthquake resilient structures.

### Indigenous Architecture in North America: Past and Present (3rd-12th grade) 🏠🗺️

Through this program, learners will investigate how Indigenous Peoples in North America created the built environment using natural resources, cultural knowledge, and environmental awareness in both the past and present day.

### Before the Museum: Civil War Origins (4th-12th grade) 🏠🗺️👤

As the site of the former pension building, the National Building Museum represents a part of Civil War history in Washington DC. Using our historic building, we will explore the history of the Civil War, and particularly the resulting need for a central pension collection building following the war.



## General Information

The Museum is open Thursday- Monday from 10 am – 4 pm. Facilitated Programs are available from 10 am – 3 pm on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays. The Museum exhibitions are not available for independent exploration on Tuesdays and Wednesdays.
